QACDG Service Projects 101

Class description:

Have you wanted some guidance in how to make QACDG Community Service projects? Instruction will focus on items created and donated to our community by our guild members. Although Community Service Bee members use a variety of patterns, we will teach class participants with simple patterns that have been popular for several years.

Participants will get to choose which items they wish to learn how to make – **a tote bag or walker tote, a pillowcase, a flannel heart, or a simple quilt block** that can be duplicated and made into a lap quilt.

Supply list:

Pre-cut kits will be provided at no cost. We created kits using donated fabric. You can assemble as many or as few kits as you choose. Your finished kit projects will be used for guild donations. However if you'd like to make items that you can keep, here is a supply list:

1. Pillowcase:
Three different fabrics: You'll need selvage to selvage pieces cut into lengths of 27 inches, 9 inches, and 3 inches.
2. Tote bag:
2 fat quarters or ½ yard for bag
2 fat quarters or ½ yard for lining
2 pieces of fabric 4" x 25" for straps
3. Hearts: 2 pieces of flannel, 8"x 8" each, per heart
4. For a quilt square. bring about 4 different fat quarters of complimentary colors.
